The IQAC selected the following goals from its five year plan (refer to AQAR January 2010 to May 2010). Care has been taken to ensure compliance with the suggestions made in the Peer Team Report (PTR).

1. To increase the number of students enrolled in the Degree College for the academic year 2011- 2012

The college, Public Relations Committee, identified Gujarati medium schools in the catchment area Santacruz to Dahisar. Faculty members visited 35 schools (as compared to 18 in the previous year). Presentations were made on the college with special focus on the courses offered and career guidance was also offered. Incentives like need based scholarship and remedial teaching were highlighted. Leaflets containing information about the college and courses were distributed. Feedback was collected from the students in order to improve the presentations made next year.

The full impact of this exercise will be known during the admissions in the following years.

2. To support academically weak and differently abled students

- **Remedial Teaching for B.A. Gujarati Medium Students for English Subject:**

The objective of Remedial English course for Non - English medium students is to help them speak and write grammatically correct English. It's a two year combined programme for B.A. I and B.A. II Gujarati medium students. Nearly 80 students enroll for the course every year and appear for the exam conducted at the end of the programme. Tests are conducted on a regular basis. This helps students to improve their language skills. The Department of English has designed a Remedial English workbook for the students to upgrade their skills. Certificates are issued to those students who pass the exam. Those students who fail have to re - appear for the exam.

Remedial English teaching has helped students to improve their language skills and has further developed their communication skills and has enhanced their confidence level.

- **Remedial Teaching for B.A. English Medium Students:**

The basic aim of Remedial Therapy is to help the students improve their English. It has been observed that students belonging to vernacular mediums or those who have their education with English language as an optional / second subject find it extremely difficult to cope with English language as the major subject at the college level. Therein, enters the need of remedial coaching wherein session are planned as per their strengths and limitations in the subject. It has been observe that constant remedial therapy has brought a major improvement in their comprehension skills. The students are better able to understand the written instructions now. They strive for improvement with every session. They are able to understand the basic theme / concept behind the stories & passages. This in turn has brought a change in their outlook towards studies. They have now gained the confidence to speak up in the class rather than being a mere spectator.

- **Remedial teaching for B. Com students - Economics**

43 students were identified for remedial teaching in Economics from B.Com I in the IInd Semester 2011. The criteria adopted for identifying students were i) students who passed in the internal exams after 2 or more attempts ii) students who had failed in Economics in the Ist Semester

Ms. Sameera Naaz was appointed as a remedial instructor. It was decided that she would meet the students once a week (Wednesday) after 12.20 pm for 1 hour. She adopted the following techniques to help the weak students

1. A brief explanation of the unit (in Hindi / English) if required
2. Writing practice in the following areas: definition, distinguish between, given reasons and long questions.
3. One test was taken.
4. A total of 16 lectures were taken.

Outcomes: The Progress of the students was continuously monitored. We compared the performance of the students in the internal exam taken in the Ist semester with that of the IInd Semester (i.e. after Remedial Teaching) which, showed that there was an improvement in their performance. The improvement in the marks scored in the internal exam after the Remedial Teaching ranged from 2 to 8 marks. The results are presented in Appendix I

3. To sustain an effective mentorship process

The college, Dept of Psychology, Staff Study Circle and the IQAC, organized a talk by Mr. Anantadeb Bandhyopadhyay.

Synopsis of the Talk:

The talk, which was largely interactive, focused on three questions What? Why? and How?. The speaker felt that it was best to begin with an experiential definition.

Some of the Questions thrown up during the discussion were. Why do I call someone a mentor? Why do I need a mentor?

Mentorship was defined as “intense reciprocal exchange between a senior experienced individual (mentor) and a less experienced individual (protégé).The speaker suggested that there were two ways of defining any process. What it is? What it is not? The speaker advised the college to create a ‘communication buzz’ about the mentoring process understanding the difference between ‘Teaching’ and “Mentoring”. Some degree of structuring is essential if the Tripartite elements Institution, Mentor, protégée’ are to benefit.

Some of the areas taken up by mentors are:- perception of self, relationship problems, performance problems, future career options, social / life skills development.

The institution would benefit in terms of a better learning environment, reputation, more open communication, higher performance levels. As far as the process is concerned a blend of formally and informally was needed. The following steps are to be taken:

1. Documentation of mentoring objectives and processes. University of Michigan
2. Mentor - Mental Match to be made. There should be an element of choice. The important Questions to consider are
 - Does everybody need to be a mentor?
 - Does everybody need to be a mentee?

It is not enough to be ‘interested’. The College has to focus on equipping teachers to be mentors and develop the competences required/

The critical success factors are

- a) Alignment with core values
- b) Training of mentors
- c) Pilot project to monitor success

Outcomes:

As per the guidance provided the college opted for the following process. The teachers who were interested in Mentoring were requested to give their names. The list was finalized. A meeting was held in which all the Class Representatives were briefed about the mentoring process. The list of teachers – mentors was given to the students. Students were free to choose their mentors. Copies of the proforma given to each teacher – mentor so that records could be maintained.

4. To prepare the socio – economic profile of F.Y. B.A. / B.Com students

Findings: (Tables in Appendix II)

➤ **Table 1.0**

- 71.3% of the students in B.Com I belong to the Hindu community as compared to 41% in B.A. I (English) medium. On the other hand, 50% of the students in B.A. I (Eng) come from the Muslim community as compared to just 15.7% in B.Com I
- On the whole the findings show that the average size of the family of a student belonging to the Muslim community is larger. Students of B.A. I (Guj) predominantly come from joint families (43.8%) and the corresponding figures for students from B.Com I and B.A. I (Eng) are 30.6% and 33.9% But we find that out 33.9%, 66% of the students of students of B.A. I (Eng) staying in joint families belonged to the Muslim community. This could perhaps explain the larger size of an average Muslim family.

➤ **Table 1.1 throws up some interesting facts**

- More than 50% of the students opting for the Commerce programme came from vernacular medium as compared to 30% in B.A. I (English) medium. For instance, 26.9% of the students in B.Com I had studied in Gujarati Medium till the Xth Standard.
- Students who have taken admission in B.Com I and B.A. I (Guj) had performed on an average far better in the Xth & XIIth standard as compared to

- those who have taken admission in B.A. I (Eng). For instance 59% of the students admitted to B.Com I had scored on an average 40 to 59% in the XIIth standard, as compared to 87% of the students who were in the same score category in the B.A. I (Eng) and 68% in B.A. I (Guj). Moreover about 30% of the students admitted to the commerce programme and B.A. I (Guj) had scored either a distinction and Ist Class in the XIIth std examination
- On the whole approximately 40% of the students belong to the Reserved category (Unfortunately students do not avail of government scholarships and other concessions because many of the students do not have a caste certificate)

➤ **Table 1.2**

- A very small percentage of parents are graduates and professionals. Most of them are engaged in some kind of small business (conclusion drawn on basis of Table 1.3 Income and Assets of the family)
- 70% of the students belonged to the income bracket of less than Rs. 1 lakh per annum. The college is catering to students belonging to the lower income groups. Only 2 to 6% of the students have an annual family income of more than Rs. 5 lakh.
- As far as assets are concerned, ownership of house, television, refrigerators and mobile phones is almost universal (about 95% in most cases). But ownership of high and consumer durable goods like cars, scooters, computers and washing machines is limited.

➤ **Table 1.3 & 1.4**

- In all 35% of our students are engaged in either formal and informal avenues, of employment supplementing family income. For a majority of them the average monthly income is less than Rs. 5000/-

- The students enjoy a considerable amount of liberty. They are allowed to frequent shopping malls, go to restaurant and movies. About 51% of the students in B.A. I (Eng) follow a strict dress code. (Table 1.1. shows that 50% of the students in B.A. I (Eng) belong to the Muslim community). Vast majority of the students observe religious ceremonies

Activities of the Research Cell

As per the decision taken in the meeting of the Research Cell held on 9th February 2010 it was decided that all the staff members would write a Book Review and make presentations on 28th and 29th March, 2011.

- To facilitate the writing of the Book Reviews Dr. Padma Prakash, with 20 years of experience in EPW and teaching experience in TISS and Mumbai University, editor of e social sciences was invited to give a talk on ‘How to write a Book Review’ on the IQAC Co-ordinator distributed relevant material to the faculty members.

Inculcating research skills in students

The Staff Study and Students Training Centre and the Research Cell organized an Intradepartmental Quiz and Research Competition. Each department was asked to identify one aspect of Vile Parle for presentation in the month of January 2011

The objective of the 'Intra - Departmental Student's Competition' was to encourage administrative students to step into the area of self learning, collecting, material, analyzing and finally presenting their ideas in an organized form.

All the Departments approached the given search area keeping in mind their subject perspective. The areas chosen were as follows:

1. English : Conducted a Quiz for the other participants based on Vile Parle
2. History : Historical Institutions of Vile Parle
3. Sociology : Sociological study of 2 institutions
4. Child Development : Centres working for Youth

1. Activities reflecting the goals and objectives of the Institution:

5. Examination reforms implemented:

a) First year and Second year examinations are conducted by the College on behalf of the University. Third year examination are conducted by the University

b) Periodical tests / examinations were conducted by the respective departments. Preliminary examinations were conducted by the Examination Committee of B.A. III

and B.Com III students were guided regularly to improve the quality of their performance.

- c) Workbooks are prepared by the Department of English and Food and Nutrition. Course material are provided by several departments
- d) Introduction of New Masking System with confidential code numbers for answer – sheets
- e) Complete outsourcing of result related work

The IQAC plans to conduct the Academic Audit in the next academic year.

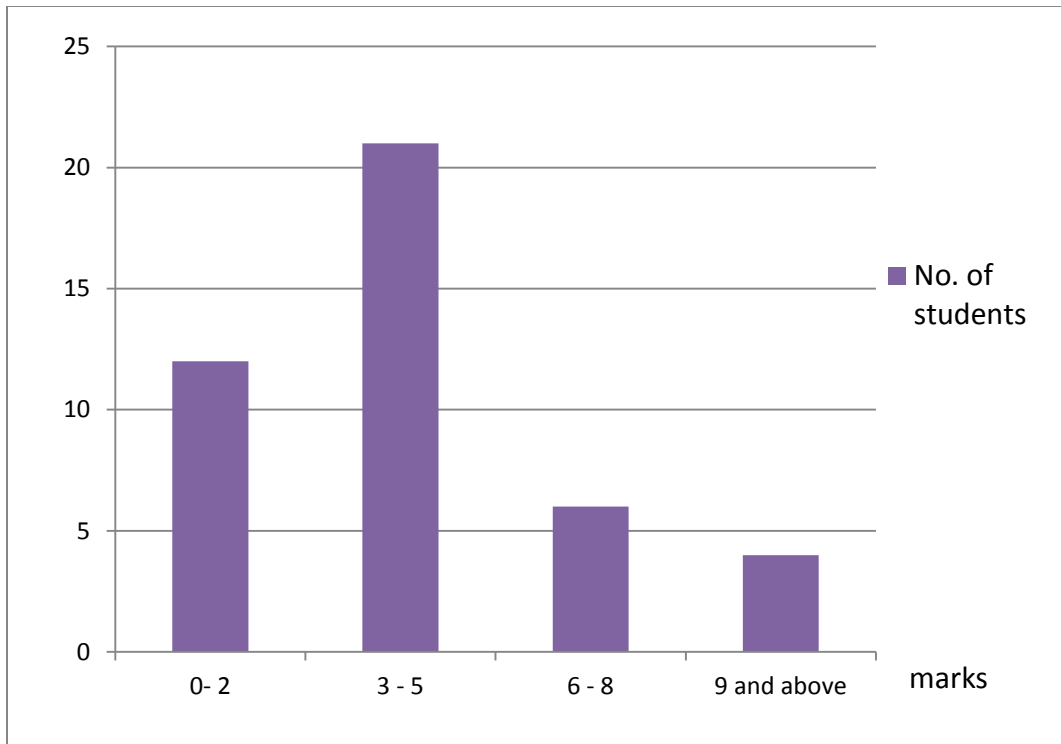
